April is Spring Clean Up Month




During the month of April, the Department of Public Works will hold various events and specials to help our residents clean up their homes:

- 1. Electronics Recycling and Paper Shredding - Saturday, April 20, 2019 - 8:00am to 12:00pm** If you have any old, important papers and old electronics, get them together and bring them to Public Works, 305-307 First Street. Only entertainment/media electronics will be accepted for this event such as televisions, stereos, computers, game systems and their accessories. Microwaves, blenders, toaster ovens and other electrical items that may have a digital display or circuitry are **not** considered electronics for this event. Chesapeake Paper Systems will also be on site with their shredding truck to shred your documents safely. Verification is needed to show that you are a City resident or City business, so please bring a driver's license or mail addressed to your City business. You can call Public Works at 301-725-0088 ahead of time to check if you live in the city limits of Laurel.
- 2. \$10 Discount for First 100 Bulk Pickup Requests - Wednesday, April 10th and Wednesday, April 24th** The first 100 residents to request a bulk pickup will have the base-fee of \$10.00 waived on these two days. Public Works will start accepting requests for April 10th's pickup on Tuesday, April 2nd, and on Tuesday, April 16th, for April 24th's pick up.
- 3. Extra Yard Debris Collections on Mondays** - During the month of April, Public Works will be offering Monday Yard Debris collections in addition to Wednesday yard debris collections. Yard debris pickups are **FREE, but residents must still call, email or submit an online request for yard debris pickups**. The deadline for our Monday pickup is the Thursday before and the deadline for our Wednesday pickup is the Monday before.
- 4. Community Dumpsters** - Community Dumpsters will be available to Homeowner Associations for residents to dispose of their bulky items on select Saturdays in April from 8:00 a.m. until noon. Call your HOA to find out if your neighborhood is participating.

Spring Has Almost Sprung!



With warmer temperatures slowly working their way into our days, be alert for lots of people heading out of their houses to walk, work and play in our city! The streets will soon be full of motorcycle and bicycle riders. Please share the roadway and be aware that many people ride in pairs or groups. Try to avoid getting between them and give them plenty of space from your vehicle. Be aware of the bike lanes in the City of Laurel and slow down when passing.

Pedestrian traffic will also increase as the weather continues to warm up. Drivers need to slow down when approaching crosswalks, even if you do not see pedestrians. If there is no traffic light and the pedestrian is within the crosswalk, they have the right of way. Officers will be out enforcing pedestrian crosswalk laws this spring.

Package Thefts

The Laurel Police are aware that porch pirates are still a major problem. Neighbors need to look out for each other and call us immediately if they see someone suspicious in the neighborhood. Try to keep track of your packages and try to utilize the post office. If you live in an apartment complex, use the leasing office or if allowed, use your place of employment to receive your packages.

Drug Take Back Day

The Laurel Police Department will be participating with the DEA for another Drug Take Back Day on April 27th from 10:00am to 2:00pm. If you are not available to turn in old or unwanted medications on that date, not to worry, the City of Laurel and the Laurel Police Department have drop boxes available every day of the week. The police department drop box is in the lobby and accessible to citizens everyday twenty-four hours a day.

Economic Development Programs

Main Street Area: The City continues to encourage business and property owners to take advantage of the Main Street Economic Development Programs. The Main Street Relocation Grant is available to apparel and shoes stores, bakeries, coffee shops, full service and fine dining restaurants, gourmet food shops, grocery stores, health clubs and yoga studios, ice cream shops, and entertainment businesses. Business owners can receive a grant of up to \$10,000. The Retail Storefront Façade Improvement grant will allow property owners with a grant of up to \$5,000 to make renovations to the exterior of their commercial properties.

Commercial Corridor Area: The Commercial Corridor Program was established to recruit new businesses to the City and assist in the expansion of existing businesses. The Program offers reduced permit fees and tax credit opportunities. The target areas for the Program are the following Revitalization Overlay Areas along US Route 1: RO-1- City Center, RO-2-Highway Corridor and RO-3-Route One Historic District and Gateway Approaches.

Live in the Historic District:

If your property is located within the Historic District, and you are considering doing exterior renovations or changes to your property Historic District Commission approval is required. Prince George's County Offering Incentives For Practices That Improve Stormwater Runoff

The Prince George's County Rain Check Rebate Program provides eligible County residents and businesses the opportunity to receive a reimbursement check for installing approved stormwater management practices that may help alleviate property flooding issues, lower water bills, and much more. Rebates up to \$4,000 for residential property owners; up to \$20,000 for commercial properties, multi-family dwellings, not-for-profit, and others.

Fire Marshal/Permit Services

Spring is almost here! Along with the nice weather, comes property maintenance and activities that can sometimes prove dangerous. Below, please find helpful information that will help keep you and your family safe during the spring and summer:

Gas and Charcoal Grill Safety

Fire up the grill! Everyone loves a cookout! However, propane and charcoal BBQ grills must only be used outdoors. Keep children and pets away from the grill area: declare a three-foot "safe zone" around the grill. Put out several long-handled grilling tools to give the chef plenty of clearance from heat and flames when flipping burgers. Periodically, remove grease or fat buildup in trays below grill so it cannot be ignited by a hot grill.

Charcoal grills - Purchase the proper starter fluid and store the can out of reach of children, and away from heat sources.

Propane grills - Check the gas cylinder hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year.

Bike and Pedestrian Safety

Whether you choose to take a bike ride around the Lake or a nice trip through the Park, there are some points to keep in mind to ensure you or your child's safety: always wear a helmet and wear bright clothes and/or putting reflectors on your bike also can help you stay safe, especially at night. Daytime riding is the safest, so try to avoid riding your bike at dusk or later.

Tall Grass Reminder

Grass will be growing! It is the duty of every person as owner, occupant, lessee or agent in charge of land in the City to maintain the grass on their property at no higher than eight (8) inches. To report tall weeds, log on to our website at www.cityoflaurel.org and click on MyLaurel Mobile App or call 301-725-5300 extension 2238.

With nights still having a chill in the air, you may choose to use your fireplace for a bit longer. Follow these Fireplace Safety Tips:

- Only burn dry, cured wood.
- Burn firewood and ONLY firewood!
- Close the damper when not using your wood fireplace.
- Keep bifold glass doors open when burning a fire.
- Have a chimney cap installed.
- Replace a poorly sealed damper to prevent heat loss.
- And have your chimney inspected and cleaned!

Recycling


